Baptism: Parent classes + Parish Sponsors

Our parish baptismal ministry includes a single-session class for parents who want to have their infant or young child baptized. (Older children and adults for baptism receive formation and are welcomed into the Church through the RCIA process.) Parents attend a class only for their first child's baptism. These parent classes are offered on the 2nd Sunday of each month, 9:30 to 10:30, upon request.

A new role in our baptismal ministry is that of parish sponsor for infant baptism. The role of parish sponsor is informal and differs from the official role of godparent or RCIA sponsor. A parish sponsor will become acquainted with the family, attend the baptism, and become a special link between the family and the
